

AUBURN WATER DISTRICT NON-ESSENTIAL OUTDOOR WATER USE RESTRICTIONS (04/27/2017)

As we find ourselves in a current period with more seasonable rainfall events, the Commissioners of the Auburn Water District are cautiously optimistic that we may hopefully be seeing an end of the recent drought conditions.

The drought conditions that we found ourselves in last summer, did not occur overnight as it took years of below normal precipitation to develop, and similarly it takes a near equal amount of time to reverse the effects of prolonged below normal precipitation amounts. With seasonal increasing temperatures and associated water demands for vegetative growth and seasonal outdoor water uses, should we encounter a period of abnormally warmer temperatures and below normal precipitation, we could easily be back into drought conditions.

Accordingly, as of May 1, 2017, the Commissioners have voted to withdraw the restriction banning all non-essential outdoor water use and to return to the Non-Essential Outdoor Water Use Restrictions that are mandated as part of the Massachusetts Department of Environmental Protection (Mass.DE.P.) Water Management Act (WMA) under the permit issued to the Auburn Water District, which requires the Auburn Water District to impose seasonal non-essential outdoor water use restrictions each year from May 1st through September 30th, with an additional drought related restriction of being limited to **only three (3) days a week on an odd / even day schedule, based on the street address of the property.**

NON-ESSENTIAL OUTDOOR USE WATER RESTRICTIONS INCLUDE:

- Non-essential outdoor water uses are **prohibited between the hours of 9 A.M to 5 P.M.**, and only allowed on an odd/even day schedule based on the address number of the property.

NON-ESSENTIAL OUTDOOR WATER USES INCLUDE:

- Irrigation of lawns via portable hose sprinklers or via automatic irrigation systems.
- Washing of motor vehicles, except in commercial car washes or as necessary for operator safety.
- Washing of exterior building surfaces, parking lots, driveways or sidewalks except as necessary to apply surface treatments such as paint, preservatives, stucco, pavement, or cement.
- The following uses may be allowed when mandatory non-essential use restrictions are in place:
 - Irrigation to establish new lawn and new plantings only during the months of May and Sept.
 - Irrigation of public parks and rec.fields by means of auto. sprinklers outside of 9 A.M. to 5 P.M.
 - Irrigation of lawns, gardens, flowers and ornamental plants by means of a **hand-held** hose.
- Water uses NOT subject to mandatory restrictions are those required
 - For health or safety reasons
 - For the production of food and fiber
 - For the maintenance of livestock
 - Hand held hose watering, water collected via a rain barrel collection system, drip irrigation and those irrigations systems supplied entirely from private wells are not restricted. Those with private wells are urged to conserve likewise.
- Watering of vegetation should be limited to a maximum total amount of one (1) inch of water per week through a combination of natural and supplemental watering.
